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Danish focus

 Participated since the early initiatives by ESAC members in 1999

 Registered as officially interested partner in 2002

 Participated in every annual meeting from 2000 including 2005

Initiatives in Denmark

- Parliamentary hearing 4 June 2003 on alternatives to animal experimentation
 - Professor Niels Thorn and I advocated strongly for the establishment of a Danish platform
 - Supported by most participating organizations
 - Taken up by
 - The Ministry of Justice in July 2003
 - Three important Danish Councils/Boards and subsequently recommended to the Danish Parliament
 - » Animal Ethical Council
 - » Council for Animal Experimentation
 - » Danish Board of Technology
 - Association of Danish Pharmaceutical Industries (LIF)

Organization of licensing authority

- Ministry of Justice
 - Council for animal experimentation
 - 11 members
 - Licensing authority
 - » 1 veterinarian and 2 secretaries
 - Members of Council
 - Chairman high court judge
 - 10 members nominated by different organizations
 - 4 members by animal welfare organizations
 - 1 member by animal ethical council
 - 2 members by research councils
 - 1 member by patients organizations
 - 1 member by regulatory authorities
 - 1 member by Danish Industry

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 - 1 member by animal ethical council
 - 2 members by research councils
 - 1 member by patients organizations
 - 1 member by regulatory authorities
 - 1 member by organization of Danish industries
 - The concept is essentially like the concept of ecopa

Organization of licensing authority

- Ministry of Justice
 - A new law about cloning of animals was decided by the Parliament October 2005
 - The regulatory authority is identical with the licensing authority
 - Only cloning for research and medical purposes are allowed

Initiatives by Ministry

- Meetings with
 - Professor Niels Thorn and myself
 - LIF representative Flemming Højelse
 - Animal welfare organizations
- Hearings to
 - Other EU member states with established platforms
 - ecopa regarding legal matters
 - Two Danish research councils
 - Danish pharmaceutical industries
 - Regulatory authorities
- Hearings finalized in 2004

Organisation of DACOPA

- 9 members, 8 ordinary members and 1 chairman
 - 2 members representing animal welfare organizations
 - 2 members representing academia via research councils
 - Research council for health and disease
 - Research council for technology and production
 - 2 members representing regulatory authorities
 - Ministry of health (pharmaceuticals, medical devices, vaccines)
 - Ministry of the environment (all other chemicals)
 - 2 members representing Danish chemical industries including pharmaceutical industries
- Chairman appointed by the Ministry
 - Chairman and ordinary members are elected for a 4 year period
- Danish ESAC member in ECVAM participate in the meetings and activities

Current process

Ministry

- Hearings finalized 2004
- Drafting bylaws for DACOPA
- Asking ministries and organizations for nominations deadline early November 2005

Timeline

- To be established early next year (January?)
- Funding
 - The ministry provide secretariat
 - The ministry will reimburse
 - Relevant traveling and accommodation costs for members of the platform
 - Participation in ecopa annual meeting
 - Sponsors within the four legs

DACOPA

 6 years of intensive work seems to conclude with establishment of a Danish Consensus Platform for Alternatives – DACOPA
